Lastly, we will be mailing letters to new ASSET members and to those in states where ASSET is not represented with a member to continue our progress of “a member in every state”. This was Mike Shaffer’s goal during his leadership term and I fully support it; we all should. In addition to our efforts to securing corporate sponsorship, we will explore options to offer an online continuing education course. Both of these can generate a steady stream of revenue for the organization to offset our annual conference costs. We will also embrace the opportunity technology affords us to pursue webcasting/ podcasting our annual conference for members unable to attend. To promote visibility of the organization, we will be linking our website to the newly established European Society for Shoulder and Elbow Therapy website and seeking reciprocating links from other national Shoulder and Elbow Rehabilitation organizations. These are small building blocks for international collaboration as we look forward to the 3rd International Congress of Shoulder and Elbow Therapists in Scotland in 2010. You can find an update from Martin Scott, about the progress of this planning within the newsletter. Lastly, I am proud that ASSET was sought after as a “stakeholder” to review the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons Guideline for Optimizing Care of Rotator Cuff Problems. This will be another opportunity to improve the visibility of the

PAST-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Planning is underway for the ASSET 2009 Annual Meeting. It will be held at The Marriott New York Marquis on Broadway in NYC in conjunction with the ASES Closed Meeting. The dates of both meetings will be Sunday October 25th – Tuesday October 27th a different part of the week than normal. To keep registration costs comparable to previous years and to allow us to meet in the same location as the surgeons, our meeting times will also be different than the past few years. Post Surgical Guidelines:

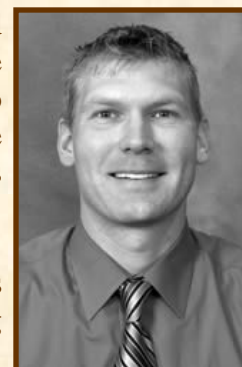

The rotator cuff guidelines are being developed by Reg Wilcox III, Brian Leggin, and Chuck Thigpen. Member comments from the annual meeting are being incorporated and a manuscript is under development to accompany these guidelines.
